



## To All Participants:

The following are Public Health - Seattle & King County requirements for booths with food/beverage samples that will be portioned and given out.

If each serving is commercially pre-packaged in individual servings and sampled without breaking the package, then the following is not required inside the booth.

- Hand washing station: The hand wash station must consist of a 5-gallon or more
  thermal container with a spigot that provides a continuous flow of warm water
  between 100 and 120 degrees F; pump soap, paper towels (not napkins), and a
  bucket to collect the dirty water. Failure to have a hand wash station properly set up
  prior to food service will result in the suspension of activity until the station is properly
  set up.
- Sanitizer: A separate bucket of sanitizer must be present for rinsing/storing wiping cloths for tabletops, counters, and so forth. One teaspoon of liquid bleach (regular, not ultra) added to one gallon of cool water will be acceptable. This should be changed frequently during the day (every 3 to 4 hours when dirty.)
- No Bare Hand Contact: Utilize tongs, spoons, scoops, deli/bakery tissues or disposable gloves to eliminate bare-hand contact with ready-to-eat foods. (If using gloves, always wash hands prior to gloving.)

Booths serving foods that are potentially hazardous and require temperature control will require a Health Department permit. (Salads and fresh fruit would require a permit).
